

Anita Münz is a draughtswoman and jewelry artist. She began drawing in 1979 and created her cycle "Liberation Pictures". The examination of female and her own sexuality leads to pictures full of joie de vivre. In 2020, 5 drawings from this series were purchased by the VERBUND COLLECTION for the collection focus "Feminist Avant-Garde of the 1970s".

At the same time, Anita Münz draws figures with long, pointed noses, which have been characteristic of her art for four decades. In her humorous works, the artist focuses on people and places them in relation to each other. The figures, whether female or male, are always the same size and symbolize the equality of the sexes.


Women are often shown as front figures, but not as domineering leaders, but as personalities who possess independence and take on responsibility. Anita Münz usually draws the outlines of the figures in a single stroke, without any markings.

In addition to her drawing work, she also works intensively on the subject of jewelry. She designs and makes jewelry and, with her formal language and choice of materials, belongs to the jewelry avant-garde of the 1980s and 90s.

Artist Statement

In her humorous drawings, Anita Münz focuses on people and deals with interpersonal relationships or interactions in the respective series.






















Anita Münz's drawings from the early 1980s resemble the eruptions of a geyser. Described by herself as liberation pictures, this series of sketches reveals the deep inner struggle that accompanies turning points in becoming. The artist notes: ,I grew up with sentences like this: pleasure in sexuality is vulgar, masturbation is forbidden.





Anita Minz

In 1979, Anita Münz began to draw and the cycle "Liberation Pictures" was created. Her exploration of female sexuality and her own sexuality led to pictures full of joie de vivre and joy in her own sexuality.

In 1981, the artist found her drawings in the wastepaper basket for the first time and was confronted with censorship at another exhibition. She had to take her pictures down again (the theater director was threatened with a lawsuit: violation of the pornography law and violation of religious feelings). In 1982, her "liberation pictures" are shown at the symposium "Art and Sexuality", where she is invited to give a lecture on this subject. In the same year, drawings by Anita Münz appeared in the magazine "Eva & Co", the first feminist cultural magazine in Europe. In 1983 she is co-organizer and exhibitor at the "Feminale" at the University of Applied Arts. Applied Arts. This was followed by exhibitions in Vienna and Graz.

At the same time, Anita Münz draws caricature-like figures. During this time, she also created enameled brooches (faces) and small wall figures as well as silver and brass jewelry in abstract forms.

Her artistic work is increasingly characterized by her involvement with jewelry, which has been the focus of her work for over three decades.

From 2007, she began to draw "figures" again, but it is only since 2018 that she has been creating entire cycles of pictures that show people, often women and men, in relation to each other. Sexuality is also a recurring theme in these pictures.

In 2020, 5 early drawings from 1981 and ,82 will be included in the "Feminist Avant-garde" collection of the VERBUND Collection and shown in the exhibition of the same name.


